For those members that were lucky enough to catch a lot of trout and noticed that they lose their flavour afer being kept them in the freezer for a long time.

Don't discard them—here is your answer received with thanks to Charles Peck.

Phil Fisher's Fish Loaf recipe.

Ingredients

1/2 cup "coffee" cream

3/4 cup of boiling water 1 Tspn grated onion

1 & 1/2 cups soft bread cubes 1 Tspn salt and a dash of pepper

1/2 cup chopped celery 2 Tspn lemon juice

1 tbsp chopped parsley 2 eggs beaten

1 nice trout

Directions

Used day old white bread ,cut into finger slices ,then into cubes

Dissolve chicken cube in boiling water.and pour over bread cubes.

2 cups of flaked fish

To flake fish, simmer skinless boneless fillets in salted water for 10 minutes or until fish flakes easily

Combine all ingredients in a mixing bowl - mix well.

Place mix in well greased loaf pan.

Bake in moderate oven (350 F/ 180C) for 1hour or until loaf is firm in the centre .

Turn out on a warmed platter and garnish.



Dunkeld

History:

The Dunkeld was first recorded in 'A book on Angling' by Francis Francis in 1867. It was initially created as a salmon fly but became an attractor pattern for trout on both rivers and Stillwater.

While many claim that it is a "fancy fly", with no obvious entomological parentage, it fishes well when the nymphs are on the move. When the fish are on daphnia the dunkeld seems to be more successful than other flies.

The Tie

Hook #10, #12, #14 Drennan traditional wet fly

Thread Black

Tail Pheasant crest

Body Flat gold tinsel

Rib Gold wire

Hackle Dyed hot orange

Wing Bronze mallard

Cheeks Jungle cock

Process

- 1. Set the hook in the vice and lay down a bed of silk.
- 2. Tie in the pheasant crest and rib, return the silk to near the hook eye.
- 3. Tie in the tinsel and wind the tinsel to the end of the body and back again in uniform even turns and tie off.
- 4. Take a small, preferably poor-quality dyed cock hackle and double it.
- 5. Tie the hackle near the hook eye with the barbules facing backwards.
- 6. Wind the hackle in open turns to the tail. (palmered version)
- 7. Secure the hackle end with the with the rib and lock it with reverse turns to the hook eye.
- 8. Trim the rib and add a rolled mallard wing and small jungle cock eye.
- 9. Varnish

This fly would be used by Jim as a first dropper in the early part of the season, progressively reducing the size as the season progresses.

This fly appeared in the August 2001 newsletter by and with thanks to Jim Ferrier for the tying instructions of his fly.

Inter-club Casting Competition 2024

For the past eight years or so there has been an annual casting competition on a 'home and away' basis between the now defunct Corralinn Fly Fishing Club and the Devonport Fly Fishing Club. The competition is to continue but from this year on it will, of course, be between the Fly Fishing Club of Tasmania and the DFFC.

The first leg of the 2024 competition was held at the DFFC venue at Northdown on Saturday 8th of June and took place at the property of one of their members. There were about a dozen members from each club that actually cast plus a few who came along just to see what it was all about. Congratulations to those who had never done the competition casting before but had a good go at it.

The weather couldn't have been better for casting, nice and sunny with barely any wind and pleasantly mild.

Competition was close and the lead changed a few times during the course of the day. But after the scores of the top four casters in each event were added up it was Devonport who finished the day winning by just seven points. Which means that had just one of us Fly Fishers casters hit the ten point ring in the final event we would have won by three points. But it was not to be and we must wait until the return leg of the competition at Grindelwald on Sunday 21st July to try and beat Devonport by at least seven points.

The Chairman introduced Jeremy Ranicar to the members.

Jeremy topic was on his fishing and exploring in the early days of Tasmania and some fishing snippets from the UK and the mainland.

Jeremy, born in India came to Tasmania in 1947 and in 1949/50 his family brought a land rover and caravan. It is believed that this was the first land rover in Tasmania. With this set up the family travelled to many waters in the highlands. They fished the Shannon Rise but because Jeremy and Piers were told their casting was too dangerous, they fished from a boat just below the bridge.

They formed a great friendship with Dick Reed visiting remote waters on horseback, or by walking. Dick had a shack at both Lake Naomi and Lake Malbena. The sight of carrying a dingy on ones back into the back lakes was incredible. Many shacks in the back lakes were built by the 3 R's – Reed, Riley and Ranicar.

A small hut from Red Hills was transferred in its entirety to Penstock Lagoon to become Jeremy's fishing shack.

His favourite water is Lake Archie's – now spelt Lake Ah Chees.

Jeremy finished with some nice salmon caught in the River Towey, Wales, some trout

in Loch Corrib, Ireland and trout in Scotland.

The Chairman along with the members thanked Jeremy for his most informative presentation.
