#### **Gear Maintenance**

Maintenance on your fly-fishing gear will increase its life and identify any issues that otherwise would go unnoticed. At the end of each season is the best time to thoroughly check, clean and assess each item.

#### Fly Line:

Normally checking and cleaning the fly line should be done regularly. Depending on the type of water fished will determine how often it is done. It should be cleaned after a visual inspection, or if it retains its coil memory. Over time a layer of grime will accumulate on your fly line which will cause your floating line to sink below the water's surface. This will result in shorter casts due to increased friction in your rod guides and even wearing a groove in the rod guides.

To clean your fly line, you will need 2 containers with warm water and 2 soft cloths. One container has 2 drops of gentle liquid hand wash and 1 cloth. Strip the line off the reel down to the backing and place in spools in the container that contains warm soapy water. Allow to soak in the soapy water for 15 - 20 minutes. Using the wet soft cloth pull the full length of the fly line through that cloth and lower into the other container that has clear warm water. The line is then dried and stretched gently by pulling through the other dry soft cloth.

Your floating line will now need to be recoated with a 'fly line dressing'. Add a few drops to a clean cloth and pull the entire fly line through the cloth in both directions. Now you can rewind back onto your reel.

#### Fly Reel:

Depending on how you have cared for it your reel should not need a major overhaul except for regular lubrication. Apply the lubrication to all moving parts and wipe away any excess lubricant.

If an overhaul is required you will need a toothbrush, screwdriver, a dish with warm water and a little liquid soap. Strip off the fly line and backing and place in large spools to avoid tangles. Place the reel and spool in the dish and scrape off the dirt and grime with either the toothbrush or screwdriver. Dry off the reel's spring clip and clutch bearing, then add a few drops of reel lubricant to the bearing and reel shaft. Reassemble the reel and spool and wind on the line.

#### Fly Rod:

Even if you do not have an expensive rod it pays to regularly inspect your rod for any nicks, frays, cracks or worn guides. There is nothing worse that arriving at your favourite water with a rod that suddenly snaps.

If there is any visible damage return the rod to a professional for repair, or replacement as required. Otherwise wipe clean with a dry soft cloth after each use and never store near any extreme heat or cold areas. When your rod is not in use it is to be stored in a safe airdrying area out of direct sunlight and always transport it within its case.

Occasionally clean your rod with warm soapy water, then dry it before storing away.

## **Solution to Twisted Fly Lines**



Most fly casters have experienced a twist in their fly line causing it to tangle and knot at their feet. I know that I have.

The reason could be many - a flawed casting stroke, a palmered fly or the wind. It definitely is frustrating particularly when you are casting to a sighted fish only to have your final cast drop short because of a knot in your line.

I have found a solution which takes only a few seconds to rectify the problem.
